Just as most of you have a Red Tractor Audit, we have our own Practice Standards Audit in January. Thank you all for playing your part in ensuring we meet the requirements, such as, always speaking to a vet prior to any medicines being prescribed, and having at least a 6 monthly visit to your farm.

Always here when you need us

Penbode have a team of 16 dedicated farm only vets. There are at least two dedicated farm vets on call every night and all weekend ensuring there will always be a vet on hand whatever your emergency.

Penbode Vets provides a **24/7 'out-of-hours' service**. 'Out-of-hours' is from 6pm to 8am Monday to Friday, from 1pm on Saturday and all day Sunday. Bank holidays are also classified as 'out-of-hours'.

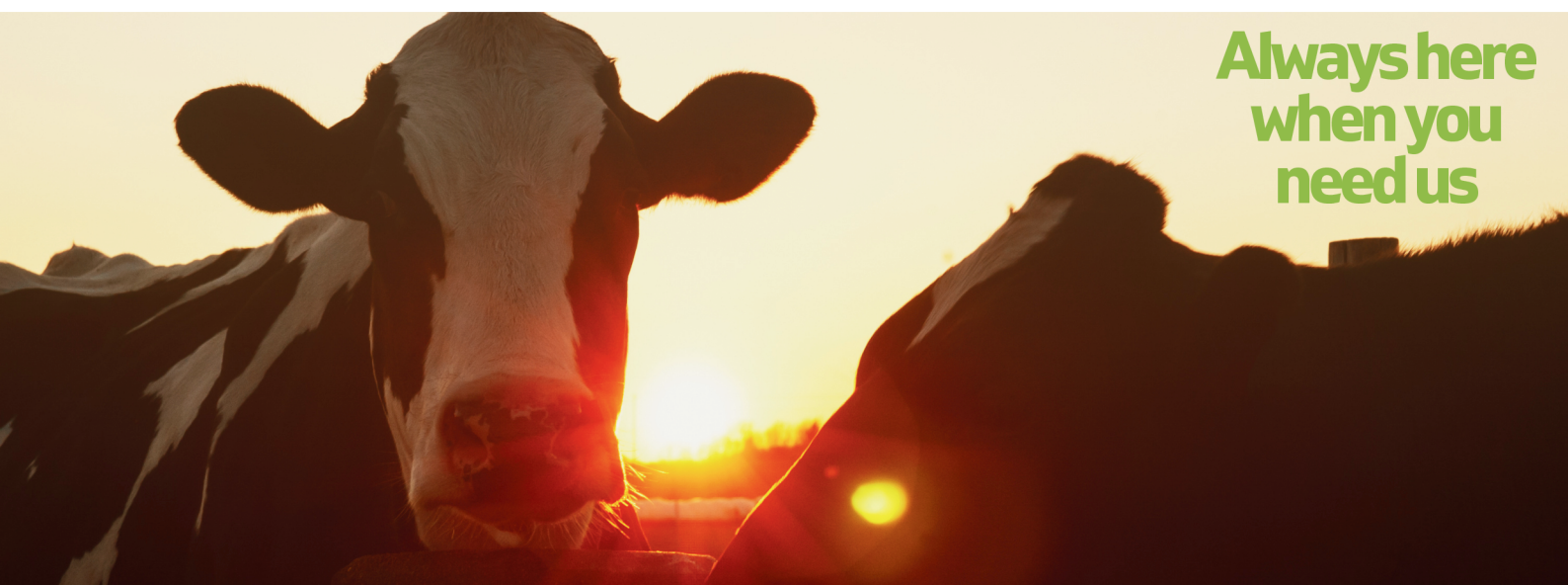
Clients can contact the surgery 'out-of-hours' by calling the normal practice day time telephone numbers :

Farm - **Stratton 01288 353766 / Holsworthy 01409 253418 / Bradworthy 01409 241241or Camelford 01840 213277**

The telephone will be answered by a member of the Penbode team who will need to take **your name, your address and a contact telephone number**. They will also ask for a brief description of the problem or reason for contacting the practice. We do not use a call answering service.

The member of staff will then organise for the duty Veterinary Surgeon to return your telephone call as soon as possible, or organise an emergency visit. We get to over 90% of emergency calls within 30 minutes.

All four farm branches have a small ruminant examination room where farmers can bring smaller animals for treatment. E.G lambing, sick calves or post mortems. A reduced visit fee will be charged if out of hours.
